This is your homework for this half term. Complete as many as you can.

- 1. Make your favourite sandwich. Ask an adult if they could help, talk to them about how to stay safe in the kitchen and the importance of hand washing.
- 2. Draw a picture that shows all of the people that are special to you.
- 3. Make handprints of everyone's hands in your family and then cut out the handprints. Can you put them in order of size from the smallest handprint to the largest?
- 4. Have a look around your home and see if you can find 3 things that you think will float and 3 things that you think will sink. Ask an adult to help you find out if you were right!
- 5. Using junk from around your home can you build a model of your house? How many windows will it need? Don't forget details like your door number!
- 6. Practise writing your name With paint, water and paintbrushes on the garden fence, in felt tip, crayon, pencil? Be as creative as you can.
