Incorporating Understanding Christianity (UC) and the Derbyshire Agreed Syllabus (DAS) 2020-2025.

Curriculum time = approx. 1 hour per week, as a C of E school: 2/3 of time = Christianity and 1/3 of time = other religions

Principal aim

The principal aim of RE is to engage pupils in systematic enquiry into significant human questions which religion and worldviews address, so that they can develop the understanding and skills needed to appreciate and appraise varied responses to these questions, as well as develop responses of their own.
