In a career spanning 35 years in the music profession Jeff Snowdon started out as a hornplayer working with many of the country's leading symphony and chamber orchestras as well as theatrical productions, including West End shows, opera and ballet.

In recent years he has dedicated much of his time to working with young musicians, developing a national reputation as a conductor, coaching youth ensembles including the Royal Birmingham Junior Conservatoire Wind Orchestra.

The core of his teaching philosophy is empowerment; helping young musicians to discover and nurture the natural musician within themselves, and to develop the technical and musical skills for successful playing.

He is currently Head of Brass at the Royal Birmingham Junior Conservatoire and Principal Musical Director of the Dark Peak Music Foundation, an organisation he founded nearly 20 years ago and which now has approaching 200 members.
